For Your Information

Resident ID or Guest Pass is required for admittance to shows, dances, and movies.

WILD

After a devastating divorce, the death of her mother (Laura Dern) and years of self-destructive behaviors, Cheryl Strayed, (Reese Witherspoon) undertakes a 1,100 mile trek through the wilderness of the Pacific Crest Trail. Alone, and with no hiking skills, Cheryl experiences the terrors as well as the pleasures of the wilderness that will ultimately heal her. Reese Witherspoon and Laura Dern were both nominated for Academy Awards for their powerful performances. R – 115 min. (Rated R for adult situations).



St. Vincent

This comedy/drama tells the story of a single mother and her young son who move into a new home in Brooklyn. Working long hours, and with no one to care for her son after school, she reluctantly hires her cantankerous, and slightly amoral, new neighbor Vincent. A wonderfully heartwarming movie with excellent performances by Bill Murray, Melissa McCarthy and Naomi Watts. PG-13, 102 min.



Into The Woods

Based on famed composer Steven Sondheim's Broadway show, this humorous and clever musical intertwines the fairy-tale stories of Cinderella, Little Red Riding Hood and Rapunzel. Adding a baker and his wife to the story, the movie goes on to explore the consequences of the characters wishes and quests. Directed by Rob Marshall the movie stars Anna Kendrick, Meryl Streep, Chris Pine, Emily Blunt, Johnny Depp and Christine Baranski. PG-125 min.



The Imitation Game

Benedict Cumberbatch was nominated for an Academy Award for his outstanding performance in the true story of Alan Turing, a mathematician and cryptanalyst. The movie follows Alan's genius as he invents the first computing machine in order to decode Nazi war messages which in turn shortens World War Two. His war hero status kept secret, Alan eventually falls prey to Britain's archaic anti-gay laws. Keira Knightley, also an Academy Award Nominee, co-stars. PG-13 114 min.



Exodus: Gods and Kings

Based on the biblical story of the Jews' escape from Egypt, this epic movie follows the rise of Moses as their leader pitting himself against the Egyptian Pharaoh, Ramses. Depicting the terrifying cycle of deadly plagues and the monumental journey of their escape, this film stars Christian Bale as Moses and Joel Edgerton as Ramses. Directed by Ridley Scott, the movie also stars Ben Kingsley and Sigourney Weaver. PG-13 150 min.



Big Eyes

Directed by Tim Burton, this thought-provoking film tells the true story of Walter Keane whose claim to fame was paintings of waifs with very large eyes that became immensely popular during the 1950s and 1960s. When the unbelievable truth of the matter comes to light, it becomes clear that the works of art were actually painted by his wife, Margaret. This biopic stars Amy Adams, Christoph Waltz and Krysten Ritter. PG-13 106 min.



Immigrant

A period drama, the film tells the story of Ewa Cybulski and her sister who leave Poland sailing to New York in order to live the American dream. Upon arrival, Ewa is released from Ellis Island but her sister is quarantined due to illness. Alone, and with no one to turn to, she falls prey to a man who forces her into prostitution, her only hope for rescue becoming a dashing stage magician. The film stars Marion Cotillard, Joaquin Phoenix and Jeremy Renner. R- 120 min. (Rated R for adult situations).

Admission is free. Tickets are not required. A CVW ID card or proper guest pass for each person is required for admittance. Please refrain from saving seats for more than one person. No admittance 10 minutes after the start of the movie.
